Munnar

One of the most popular tourist attraction in Kerala is Munnar hill stations. With vast variety of plants, trees, herbs, Birds, a wide variety of animal life some of them are not exist nowhere else in the world.

Munnar Situated at the confluence of three mountain streams. Located at 1600m above sea level, this was once the summer resort of the British Government in South India. Rich flora & fauna, sprawling tea plantations, picture book towns, winding lanes, trekking and holiday facilities and cool climate make Munnar a unique experience. Most of the native flora and fauna of Munnar have disappeared due to severe habitat fragmentation resultant from the creation of the plantations. However, some endemic species including Nilgiri Tahr, the Grizzled Giant Squirrel, the Nilgiri Wood-pigeon, Asian Elephant, the Gaur, the Nilgiri langur, the Sambar, and the Neelakurinji flower (that blossoms only once in twelve years).

Wayanad


This green paradise is nestled among the mighty mountains of the Western Ghats. Clean and pristine, enchanting and hypnotizing, this land is filled with history and culture.

Flora and Fauna



Most of Kerala, whose native habitat consists of wet evergreen rainforests at lower elevations and highland deciduous and semi-evergreen forests in the east, however, significant variations in terrain and elevation have resulted in a land

whose bio diversity registers as among the world's most significant.

In turn, the forests play host to such major fauna as Asian Elephant, Bengal Tiger, Leopard, and Nilgiri Tahr and Grizzled Giant Squirrel. More remote preserves, including Silent Valley National Park, harbor endangered species such as Lion-tailed Macaque, Indian Sloth Bear, and Gaur-the so called "Indian Bison". More common species include Indian Porcupine, Chital, Sambar, Gray Langur, Flying Squirrel, Swamp Lynx, Boar, a variety of catarrhine Old World monkey species, Gray Wolf and Common Palm Civet.

A variety of snakes, various turtles and crocodiles are to be found in Kerala. Kerala has about 453 species of birds such as the Sri Lanka Frogmouth, Oriental Bay Owl, the Great Hornbill and Indian Grey Hornbill, as well as the more widespread birds such as Indian Cormorant, Jungle Myna, Oriental Darter, Black-hooded Oriole, bulbul, species of Kingfisher and Woodpecker, Jungle Fowl, Parakeet, and assorted ducks and migratory birds. Additionally, a wide variety of freshwater fish also are native to Kerala's lakes and waterways.

Eastern Kerala's windward mountains shelter tropical moist forests and tropical dry forests which are generally characteristic of the wider Western Ghats: crowns of Indian rosewood, anjili, Erythrina, Cassia, and other trees dominate the canopies of large tracts of virgin forest. Overall, Kerala's forests are home to more than 1,000 species of trees. Smaller flora include bamboo, wild black pepper, wild cardamom, and aromatic Vetiver grass.




